In February, the full CRC compiled a set of **priorities** to seed subcommittee discussion **topics**.

Starting 3/7, subcommittees will start reporting on how their discussions/**topics** are evolving into **concepts** that could result in charter amendments.

By **3/28** all subcommittee and COW **concepts** have been vetted by the CRC. Those receiving support from at least 60 percent of CRC members will be labeled as **proposals** eligible for being drafted into Charter Amendments.

By **4/22** all **proposals** will have received enough discussion and have had language drafted sufficient to allow the CRC to compile a final list of possible Charter Amendments, in near-final form.

By **4/29** the CRC will have concluded voting on all Charter Amendments in their final form.

By **5/2** the CRC will have finalized its report to the City Council, ensuring the narrative correctly captures pro/con statements and expressed opinions or themes which lacked majority support.
