Term Limits

Number of Council Meetings

City of Tacoma is a Municipal Corporation

- Charter Section 1.1, 1.2
 - City is a Municipal Corporation a "body corporate" and a "body politic" that can exercise the political power of the state as a subordinate with local legislative powers
- State Constitution Article XI Section 10
 - Directs Legislature to provide for the incorporation of Cities
- RCW 35.01 classifies Municipal Corporations
 - Tacoma is a first class City, due to population at time of organization and has a Charter
- Powers and authority of Municipal Corporations includes
 - enter into contracts, issue indebtedness, operate police and fire departments, sue and be sued, hold and dispose of property, acquire rights and liabilities, operates continuously in "perpetual succession"

Council Governs Municipal Corporation

- Council is the legislative and governing body of the municipal corporation
- Charter Section 2.1 Council composed of Mayor + 8 Council Members
 - Pre-1973 amendments there were no districts, all 8 were at large
 - Council Members must be residents of City 2 years prior to running and 1 year resident in district if running in district election
- Following 1973 amendment to establish Council Districts were set by Charter
 - Charter Section 5.3, Council to divide into 5 districts, 3 are at large
 - TMC .144.020-060 set out the boundaries of the 5 districts
 - Redistricting is governed by state law RCW 29A.76 uses census data
 - As equal in population as possible, as compact as possible, geographically contiguous, not to favor or disfavor racial group or political party, as feasible coincide with existing natural boundaries and to preserve communities of related and mutual interest

Term Limits

- Charter Section 2.35 No person allowed to serve on Council for more than 10 consecutive years either as Councilmember or Mayor or both
 - Change in 1973, Charter previously was silent, other than 4 year terms
 - 10 years was probably to account for partial terms/appointments
 - Council members who cease to be qualified, or fail to attend more than 3 meetings unexcused, are "deemed" to forfeit office, **if** Council enforces
 - Council and Mayor can be removed according to recall provisions in state law
 - Council vacancies in office are filled by appointment by the Council, if Council doesn't appoint in 60 days Mayor appoints with Council confirmation

Council Procedure

- Charter Section 2.8 and 2.9
 - Council meets at such times and places as it determines, with public meetings no oftener than once a week and at least 46 times per year.
 - Subject to limitations in Charter and law Council establishes its own rules and order of business
 - Quorum is 5
 - 5 votes required to pass ordinance or resolution
- Every legislative act is by ordinance, codified as TMC
