On 03-04-2020 at around 0014 hours, I was contacted by SS 911 and asked to call Lt Messineo regarding an in-custody death. I was the acting Criminal Investigations Bureau (CIB) Lt. At around 0016 hours, I contacted Lt Messineo by phone. He advised the Tacoma Police (TPD) were involved in a struggle with a subject at 96th St S/Ainsworth Ave S. The subject had been tased and hobble restraints had been used. The subject was now deceased. He had responded to the scene along with Det/Sgt Sanders. Det/Sgt Sanders helped secure the subject's legs for the hobbles. TPD Lt Mueller was on scene.

I had SS911 send out an Everbridge for available CIB personnel from the Officer Involved Shooting/Major Incident Team to respond to the scene. I advised Lt Roberts, Chief Lawrence, TPD Lt Lane and Keith Barnes with the Prosecutor's Office. I confirmed that the Sheriff's Department would be the lead investigating agency for this case. I notified SS-911 I was responding and requested the radio traffic for the call be sent to a secured server for review.

At around 0138 hours, I arrived in the area from the east. It was 41 degrees, windy and occasional light rain. TPD's Internal Affairs Unit was advised and members were on scene. Lt Messineo and Det/Sgt Sanders were on scene. I learned that the subject was not handcuffed yet when Det/Sgt Sanders and Lt Messineo arrived. I learned the names of the TPD Officers involved. Officers Burbank and

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Collins were a double unit and were involved in the initial struggle. Officers Ford and Rankine were a double unit and arrived to assisted with the hobble restraint. These four Officers were at the Parkland Spanaway Precinct with their Guild Representative TPD Officer Betts. TPD Sgt Lim had also been on scene for some of the incident.

I was informed by Lt Messineo that a fingerprint scanner had been used to identify the subject as Manuel Ellis DOB 08-28-86. The initial call came out at 2322 hours and Manuel was pronounced at 0012 hours. TPD Officer Chung was assigned to write the .1 report. I learned that Manuel's body core temperature was taken by the Fire Department 40 minutes after his death and was 96.7 degrees. The taser probes had been removed from Manuel. The taser wires were later booked into evidence by TPD.

At around 0200 hours, Lt Messineo briefed myself and members of CIB on the case. Forensics Investigators Wilkins and Mell were also on scene. Lt Messineo had been working off duty in the area. Det/Sgt Sanders was also working off duty at PLU. They heard over the radio that TPD was fighting with a subject near 96th St/Ainsworth Ave S. When they arrived, there were four TPD Officers on scene and Manuel was face down on the ground. The TPD Officers were trying to handcuff him. He described Manuel as fighting, kicking and making animalistic noises. A hobble restrained was used to control him. Det/Sgt Sanders had helped them by holding Manuel's feet. Lt Messineo said Manuel went quiet but was snorting and moaning. TPD called for medical aid. Manuel was moved to the recovery position. Tacoma Fire and TPD conducted CPR on Manuel. The hobble restraint had also been removed.

The area had streetlights on that lit up the area. Officer Collins marked patrol SUV was still parked in the road facing east. Manuel was lying on his back to the west of the patrol vehicle in the street. He was wearing a black sweatshirt (cut off), purple shorts, yellow sweatpants (cut off) and white shoes. I made the following assignments. I assigned Detective Catey and Detective Moss to conduct interviews at PSSP. Detective Dos Remedios and Detective Hotz also assisted at PSSP. Detective Catey and Detective Hotz did interviews of Lt Messineo and Det/Sgt Sanders. Detective Moss conducted a round count and Taser collection with Forensics Investigator Wilkens for the involved TPD Officers. They were also photographed. I assigned Det/Sgt Loeffelholz to document the scene. I learned that a hobble restraint was used by an unknown TPD Officer at the time and had been grabbed out of one of the TPD Officer's patrol vehicles. We did not know at the time who had used it and where it was located. There was a full one liter bottle of water and a box of donuts not far from the passenger side of the involved patrol vehicle. Those items were photographed at the time. 3D scans were also conducted of the scene.

I learned a short time later from Det/Sgt Catey that the four involved TPD Officers would not be making a statement tonight according to TPD Officer Guild Rep Betts. These interviews would be conducted a few days later.

I contacted Thomas Boghosian as he came out of his residence at 1437 S 96th St. His wife was leaving for work soon and wanted to see about leaving. I asked him if he heard anything last night. He said no that he was home with three other people but no one heard or saw anything. They did not have cameras.

At around 0300 hours, M.E. #32 investigator Atzet arrived on scene. He took photos of the scene as well. I assisted in loading up Manuel onto the gurney. At around 0330 hours, I cleared the scene. The patrol vehicle was released to TPD. I arrived at PSSP a short time later. I reviewed the radio traffic for the incident. I received an update from Detective Moss. A round count had been conducted. Four Tasers had been collected and TPD Collins had some minor injuries.

At around 0547 hours, Det/Sgt Loeffelholz, Detective Catey and Detective Dos Remedios attempted to canvass the area for any witnesses that might be leaving for work or school. We contacted the residence at 1442 they were sleeping during the incident and did not have cameras. We conducted the residence at 1438 96th St S. We had noticed a doorbell camera. Aiyana White answered the door and did not know how to work the system. I obtained her contact info as she asked us to come back later. Over the course of the investigation, Detective Helmcke was able to get the footage from the camera system at White's residence by contacting the homeowner who could access it. Detective Helmcke advised the camera was motion activated and had audio. Detective Helmcke also wrote a search warrant to make sure we had all the footage from the provider.

We knocked on several more doors in the neighborhood but no one answered. Another canvass was planned for later on. I was in contact with the attorneys Steve Myers and Mike Staropoli for the TPD Officers interviews. The interviews for Officers Burbank and Rankin were set up for 03-06-20 and Officers Collins and Ford for 03-09-20.

On 03-04-20 at around 0930 hours, I attended the autopsy of Manuel along with Deputy Laiuppa and Prosecutor Investigator Barnes. See Dr Clark's ME report for additional information and toxicology report when completed. I began to work on a timeline of events at Dr Clark's request.

At around 1227 hours, I called Ed Patterson back after he left me a voicemail. He was the stepfather of Manuel and he was with Manuel's mom Marcia Cater at the time. I provided them with an update on what was known at the time regarding the case. I explained the toxicology report could take several weeks.

On 03-05-20 at around 0900 hours, Detective Helmcke conducted another canvass along with Detective Dos Remedios. I contacted Shad Hayes the resident at 1433 96th St S. He lived just northeast of the incident. He conducted a recorded interview. The following is a summary of the interview. See the transcript for details. Shad had lived at the residence for a few weeks. He was awake watching TV at the time. He heard some yelling outside and then saw some flashing lights from his bedroom window. He went outside and noticed the patrol vehicle sitting at the light with its lights on. He saw two Officers trying to subdue a person in the middle of the street. He described it as a Ford Explorer SUV with lights on. He said "Yeah, the lights were on. They were sitting in, right in the middle of the intersection, stopped with the lights on. I saw two Officers tryin' to subdue this individual and they were havin' problems subduing him because he was, I don't know if he was drunk or high on drugs or whatever, but he was, but he was throwin' 'em around pretty good. And I yelled at 'em and asked if they need help and they said no, they think we've got it. But while they were tryin' to subdue him there was traffic and stuff goin' by so I stood right down here and directed traffic until I heard the back, 'til I heard their backup comin' and they came from that direction on Pacific Avenue. And then I came back in and just after that watched TV." He could not make out what the yelling was about until he went outside.

He said one of the Officers was on the ground trying to get the subjects hands behind his back and the other Officer was bending trying to subdue him from the top. He described them as having problems and the subject was trying to get up and move around. He described the subject as laying face down on the ground. He said the subject was "Tryin' to get up and fightin' with 'em and stuff. Not, I, I didn't see any punches swung but you could tell just by he wasn't complying. He wasn't givin' his arms and they were tryin' to get him to subdue him." He described the incident occurring in front of their patrol vehicle. He could not make out what the subject was saying other than yelling. He heard one of the Officers say "comply". He was not sure if they were able to get handcuffs on but their backup showed up. He described them as finally able to get him subdued. I asked him how the subject was positioned as they wrestled with him. He said it looked like the whole time he was facedown. I asked him if he observed anything else from the Officers other than wresting with him. He said "No, I didn't. It didn't look to me like at any time he got up and any blows or anything exchanged. It didn't look like that, it looked to me like from what I saw most of the time they had him on the ground but he wasn't complying with their orders to put his hands behind his back so they could subdue him." He did not observe any strikes by the Officers. He added that the Officers had been struggling with the subject by the time he got out there. He did not know how long they had been struggling with the Officers. He did not see the subject stand up in the time he observed the incident. He mentioned that the Officers were having a hard time because the subject was a bit bigger than them. He did not get close enough to observe any clothing the subject was wearing.

He did not recognize the subject from the neighborhood. He talked about directing traffic around the incident as cars had been trying to pass by. This was later observed on the surveillance video from 1438 96th St S. We knocked on several more doors in the neighborhood including 9614, 9712 and 9714 16th Ave S. The occupant of 9714 was home at the time but did not see or hear anything. I contacted Alexander Faaoloaga at 1528 97th St Ct S. He came home around 0200 hours and noticed a body in the road (well after the incident). I talked with the occupant at 9619 Ainsworth Ave S. He saw several police lights but could not see what was going on due to the fence and neighbor's property.

This same day at around 1500 hours, I called Manuel's brother Matthew back after he left me a voicemail. I updated him on the case with what was known at the time. He asked to be the point of contact for the family.

On 03-06-20 at around 1120 hours, Detective Helmcke and I conducted a recorded interview Officer Chris (Shane) Burbank at PSSP. His attorney Steven Myers and Prosecutor Investigator Barnes were present for the interview. The following is a summary of the interview. See the transcript for details. I provided an overview ortho of the area for reference and for each interview. He later drew the scene on the whiteboard which I took a photo of with my department phone. I later uploaded the image into the server.

Officer Burbank had worked for TPD for over 4 years and was assigned as a Patrol Specialist. He had also worked as a patrol officer in Winston Salem, North Carolina for five years with two years in street crimes. He was also currently part of a Collision Investigation Team. He was also a Staff Sgt in the Army for 8 years. He worked with Officer Collins that night in Collins patrol SUV. He was the passenger. They normally work from 2000 to 0600 hours. They had cleared a traffic stop near 96th and A St. They were

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headed west on 96th St S and stopped at a red light at Ainsworth Ave S. They observed the suspect in the roadway/intersection. (I will refer to the suspect as Manuel for the rest of the interviews). He noticed a vehicle travelling north trying to head west on 96th St. He said Manuel ran up to the front of the vehicle, waved his hands and blocked it. He talked about the streetlights and it was around 2320 hours. He described the weather as cold 40-45 degrees. He described Manuel and what he was wearing. Manuel was carrying a jug of water in one hand and other items in the other. He did not recognize him from any previous contacts.

He said Manuel tried to open the front passenger door of the vehicle and enter it. He did not know if this was a carjacking or disturbance. Manuel tried the door several times and the vehicle drove off. Manuel then fixated on their patrol vehicle. Manuel ran over and Officer Collins talked to him through the driver's window now rolled down. He noticed Manuel was extremely sweaty and hypervigilant. He was talking quick. He told them he was having a bad day, needed help and had warrants. Officer Collins said they would help and told him to walk over to the sideway. Manuel diverted to the passenger door. He started to put his window down and told Manuel to go to the sidewalk. He described Manuel as agitated. Manuel told him he was "really hot" and needed help. He was still seated in the passenger seat. Manuel told him "I might just punch you in the fuckin' face." Manuel dropped what was in his hands. He rolled the window up and Manuel struck the window with his fists 2-3 times as hard as he could. Manuel reached for the door handle. He felt like Manuel was trying to assault him. He could not defend himself in the seated position.

He observed Officer Collins exit the vehicle. Manuel squared up to Officer Collins in a fighting stance with clenched fists. He used his door to hit Manuel to draw his attention away from Officer Collins. Manuel was a foot or two from the vehicle. He exited the vehicle. When he got out Officer Collins and Manuel were on the ground. He described Officer Collins trying to pin the suspect to the ground. He said "And the suspect was just swinging both left and right fists as hard as he could, very wildly, at Officer Collins, and kicking him, basically trying to like throw him off of him and strike him at the same time." He described Manuel as kicking wildly and swinging his fist as hard as he could striking Officer Collins. He delivered strikes to Manuel's body.

He said Manuel seemed very strong and that he pushed Officer Collins off of him. Manuel was screaming and growling. His strikes were not effective and there was no pain compliance. Manuel started to stand up and throw Officer Collins off of him. Manuel got to his feet. He ran and got distance from Manuel. Manuel then sprinted at him, screaming and growling. Manuel was flailing both fists at him. Manuel collided with him and they both went to the ground. He remembered getting struck in the mouth. He described the strikes as wild and un-aimed. He said Manuel was on his back with Officer Collins trying to pin his upper body down and delivering strikes to Manuel's face. The strikes were not effecting Manuel. He had been thrown off by Manuel as he was trying to control his legs. He said it looked like Officer Collins was trying to put on a LVNR. He could not tell if Officer Collins was successful. He was not sure if Officer Collins was able to transmit over the radio that they were fighting.

He deployed his taser from 2-3 ft away from Manuel. He said "As soon as I deployed the taser it was effective in stopping that assault and that, and that kind of like that superhuman strength we felt like he had. He continued to yell but it appeared like he had actually, it kind of gave him that incapacitation to where he locked up." When the 5 second cycle was done the effectiveness went away and Manuel started to stand up. He fired the taser again and Officer Collins was able to get Manuel back to the ground. Manuel was on the ground with his hands under his body. Manuel was still growling and yelling. He delivered a third taser cycle for 5 seconds with locked up Manuel. Manuel was able to ripe his arms back under his body. He thought he delivered a fourth taser cycle. They were able to pull Manuel's arms into the cuffing position. Manuel was still growling and yelling in coherently. They put handcuffs on Manuel.

He as exhausted and could hear sirens coming. Manuel was trying to roll and buck them off. He noticed Sgt Lim arrived. Someone asked about hobbles to retrain his feet. He went and grabbed the hobble restraint from the glove box. He was able to secure his ankles and secured the hobble to the handcuffs. He thought this incident from the initial contact to getting him into handcuffs was 2-3 minutes. He went to catch his breath. Manuel tried to spit at Officers. His handgun magazines had fallen out during the incident. He thought Manuel had calmed down and he was rolled to his side. His hat was under Manuel. The Fire Department arrived for their eval. He described Manuel as staring and blinking his eyes. CPR was started and he ended up putting the hobble restraint back in the patrol vehicle.

He thought he could taste blood in his mouth but Sgt Lim could not see any injury. He did have pain in his left knee and left elbow. He had abrasions on his left knee. The next morning his left upper arm was sore, shoulder and lower right jaw were sore as well. He talked about the commands he gave

telling Manuel to get on the ground. The last time he had contact with Manuel he was taking the hobbles off and Manuel's eyes were open.

Over the course of the investigation, I checked out the four tasers from evidence. I was able to get two of the Tasers downloaded for Officers Rankin and Collins with the assistance of Sgt Leach. Rankin's taser had not been armed or used during the incident. Collins's time was ahead by 8 minutes. According to the download, Collins' taser was armed at 23:40 (corrected to 23:32) but not fired. The other two had to be downloaded by TPD due to being assigned to them according to the taser program even though all four were assigned to TPD. I went to TPD HQ and had TPD Officer Moses download Officer Ford's taser. It had not been armed or used during the incident. I returned those three tasers to TPD HQ and notified TPD Lt Lane. I had TPD Officer Chell download Officer Burbank's taser at TPD HQ. The time was ahead by 3 minutes. The taser was fired three times at 23:25:03, :26 and :51 (corrected to 23:22 hours). I placed Officer Burbank's taser back into evidence. I had all the taser downloads printed.

On 03-06-20 at around 1245 hours, Detective Helmcke and I conducted a recorded interview Officer Timothy Rankin at PSSP. His attorney Steven Myers and Prosecutor Investigator Barnes were present for the interview. The following is a summary of the interview. See the transcript for details. I provided an overview ortho of the area for reference. He later drew the scene on the whiteboard which I took a photo of with my department phone. I later uploaded the image into the server.

Officer Rankin had been with TPD for just under two years. He worked from 2000 to 0600 hours. He worked with Officer Ford in a two man vehicle. He was in the Army for 6 years including the First Ranger Battalion. He worked for the Department of State as well. He was driving his vehicle that night a Ford Crown Victoria and Officer Ford was the passenger. They had back up Officer Collins and Officer Burbank on a traffic stop 5 to 10 minutes prior. They were near 84th and Pacific when they heard mic clicks which were very short transmissions on the radio. He heard radio ask H-317 if he had traffic. The mic clicks continued. He thought he heard Officer Burbank's voice over the radio. He described Officer Burbank calling out his location and that he sounded stressed/panic kind of voice. He activated their lights and sirens. They continued to hear mic clicks on their way. They headed west on 96th St S from Pacific Ave S. Radio advised they were going to open their radio mics to hear what was going on. He described hearing rustling. Like a physical altercation with heavy breathing. He noticed Officer Collin's vehicle ahead. He described the patrol vehicle in the middle of the roadway stopped with the back amber lights lit. He could not see them at first. He eventually saw three people about 10-15ft from Officer's Collin' vehicle.

He called out that they had arrived over the radio. He noticed Manuel was prone out on the ground on his stomach. He noticed Officer Burbank was on top of Manuel's torso with both hands pressed down on his body. He observed Officer Collins trying to secure both legs. He described Manuel as throwing them around like rage dolls. He helped Officer Collins try to secure Manuel's legs. He then assisted Officer Ford in securing Manuel's right leg. He remembered Officer Burbank asking for help. Manuel was kicking and bucking pretty violently. He and Officer Ford checked to make sure that Manuel's hands were cuffed up. He noticed a taser had been applied due to the taser wires in Manuel's upper torso. He said ".....So as I transitioned to help Officer Burbank with the torso, I placed my right knee on his right shoulder area and then my left knee on his lower back and securing his right arm, because he still was violently thrashing around. As I was doing that Officer Burbank moved off of him and the individual did, I would say, I can't remember exactly but almost like a bucking move that tossed Officer Burbank off of him pretty violently. I remember seeing Officer Burbank roll on the ground towards like the left side of his body....".

He described Manuel making strange animal grunting noises. Manuel continued to wiggle around and pulled all four of them across the roadway. He said ".....So once I was seated on the subject's back, placing my weight, like distributing my weight evenly across his torso, one of the things I thought was really weird was the first time I actually heard this subject even speak and the first thing he said to me was I can't breathe, I can't breathe. He described his voice as calm and normal. He told him that if he was talking he was breathing just fine. He told Manuel if he stopped struggling and calm down he would relieve pressure off of him. Manuel violently thrashed again. Other Officers were able to put Manuel into the hobble restraints. He talked about Sgt Lim arriving. He described Officer Burbank and Officer Collins uniforms as disorientated. He talked about Officer Burbank showing Sgt Lim his mouth where he had been struck. He instructed other Officers to roll Manuel to his side. He added that Manuel was warm to the touch and was sweating profusely. They rolled him to his right side and he conducted a weapons check of Manuel. He talked about removing the taser probes and what Manuel had been wearing. He thought Officer Ford helped him secure the probes and wires. He talked about Manuel thrashing all over again and he was rolled back onto his stomach. The Fire Department had been advised to respond. He noticed

Manuel had minor cuts on his face and his knuckles were bloody. He remembered Sgt Lim asking Fire for an ETA. He heard someone say the Fire was not running priority and noticed them approaching with no lights on. He thought Sgt Lim had told dispatch that the Fire Department was needed priority.

He noticed Manuel was still breathing as he could see his chest rise and fall. He rolled Manuel back to his side as he could see the Fire Department was arriving. He checked his pulse and noticed it was around 80 BPM. They took the handcuffs and hobble restraints off of Manuel. As the Fire Department continued to treat Manuel he noticed his eyes were open and he was still breathing on his own. He assisted with conducted CPR on Manuel. A fingerprint reader was used to help identify Manuel. He looked at his DOL photo and tattoos as well.

He described the lighting conditions in the area/intersection as well lit. He talked about the weather being cold. He was not sure if Manuel was handcuffed until he was able to rotate his torso to see his hands behind his back. I asked him about his medical aid training. He had a Combat Lifesaving Course, Tactical Combat Casualty Care among other training. He had learned as much as he could from Special Forces Medics.

He talked about his knees being a little sore from sprawling out and trying to hold Manuel. He was not sure how long Manuel was on his stomach while in hobble restraints.

On 03-09-20 at around 0930 hours, Detective Hotz and I conducted a recorded interview Officer Matthew Collins at PSSP. His attorney Michael Staropoli and Prosecutor Investigator Barnes were present for the interview. The following is a summary of the interview. See the transcript for details. I provided an overview ortho of the area for reference. He later drew the scene on the whiteboard which I took a photo of with my department phone. I later uploaded the image into the server.

Officer Collins had been with TPD for the past five years. He worked patrol from 2000-0600 hours. His additional duty assignments include the SWAT Team, controlled tactics instructor, firearms instructor and shield instructor. He was in the military for 8 years as Staff Sgt. The night of the incident he was driving his Ford Explorer patrol SUV and Officer Chris Burbank was his partner. They were travelling west on 96th St S and stopped for a red light at Ainsworth Ave E. He noticed Manuel in the middle of the intersection and thought there was a disturbance. He noticed Manuel was working on trying to open the passenger door of a vehicle that was turning. The vehicle was trying to move around Manuel to make the turn. He was not sure if it was DV, attempted carjacking or if he had been kicked out of the vehicle.

He rolled down his window asked him to come over to see what was going on. Manuel jogged over to him and got abnormally close to the vehicle. He described Manuel's eyes at super wide and he was sweating on the top of his head. Manuel told him that he had warrants and that they needed to talk. He told him to go sit on the curb and he would come talk to him. He went to call out on the radio and noticed Manuel was now fixated on Officer Burbank staring at him. He heard Manuel tell Officer Burbank he was going to punch him in the face. Officer Burbank started to roll the window up and Manuel began punching the window. He said there was a struggle over the door. He got out and went to try and get control of Manuel. Manuel turned to him, ran at him and grabbed his external vest carrier. Manuel lifted him off his feet and threw him on his back on the street. He described Manuel as having superhuman strength. He mentioned he was 215 pounds without gear and around 230 pounds with gear. He described being lifted off his feet like a child. He got back up. They were in a physical fight with Manuel from this point on. He said it was a melee. His background included grappling.

He ended up on top of Manuel. He described Manuel making growling and making animal noises. He struck Manuel but it did not have an effect. Manuel was on his back and was lifting him up. They both fell and wear lying on their sides. He attempted to LVNR him from behind. Before he could apply the LVNR, Officer Burbank had his taser out. Officer Burbank fired the taser and it was effective. Manuel was in full lock up. They tried to grab his arms but the taser cycle ended. Manuel started to growl again. Manuel was still fighting. Officer Burbank fired the taser again and it was effective. They eventually got him into handcuffs but he said he came back again growling. Manuel was trying to stand up. Officer Burbank got on Manuel's back and he held his feet. He could hear sirens in the background. He asked for the hobble restraints because they still did not have control of Manuel. Officers Ford and Rankin arrived. Officer Burbank brought the hobble restraints. Manuel was placed in the restraints.

He said he was "pretty smoked" as several more Officers arrived. He could feel the lactic acid build up in his forearms. He backed up with Officer Burbank. He heard Officer Burbank to put Manuel in the recovery position. Manuel was put on his side and Office Collins walked away. He remembered Manuel spitting at people, someone put the spit mask on him and the Fire Department arrived. He talked to the Fire Department about Manuel's freakish strength that he had not been speaking and that it could be excited

delirium. A short time later the Fire Department started CPR. He debriefed TPD Sgt Lim on what had occurred.

I asked him about his injuries. He said he right knee was pretty swollen and covered in road rash/cuts. He said his right knee was pretty bad. Both of his elbows were banged up with road rash and bruising. He did not recognize Manuel from any previous contacts. He remembered the weather being clear and cold. I asked him if anything was effective with pain compliance. He said absolutely not. He noticed Manuel had a cut on his face during the incident. He thought the fight lasted 3-4 minutes. I asked him if Manuel's action were of someone trying to get away or attack. He said "No, you know, normally, almost, almost every fight that we get in, it's, there's a, a fight to not get taken into custody, and then they look for a chance to escape. But there was absolutely none of that. And when I came around the car, he was coming at Shane, he turned to me. When he tossed me like that in the middle of the intersection, he went back to Shane and then I re-engaged him. I mean it was like multiple times where he was just going back and forth between the two of us. I mean he was pressing in this fight. He never tried to disengage."

He described the area of the intersection as well lit. He mentioned there were a few up and down engagements. He remembered Manuel carrying a plastic grocery bag with him. He used elbow strikes to Manuel's face that were not effective. He had been telling Manuel to stop and roll onto his stomach. He had been a controlled tactics instructor for three years. I asked him about his grappling background. He had training for 12-15 years and was a coach in the military.

On 03-09-20 at around 1245 hours, Detective Hotz and I conducted a recorded interview Officer Masyih Ford at PSSP. His attorney Michael Staropoli and Prosecutor Investigator Barnes were present for the interview. The following is a summary of the interview. See the transcript for details. I provided an overview ortho of the area for reference. He later drew the scene on the whiteboard which I took a photo of with my department phone. I later uploaded the image into the server.

Officer Ford had been working for TPD for the past two years. He worked for Pierce Transit for two years as a commissioned public safety officer. He worked from 2000 to 0600 hrs. He worked with Officer Rankin that night and they were in Officer Rankin's vehicle a Crown Victoria. He talked about being near 84th St E and McKinley when they heard mic clicks. They had back Officers Collins and Burbank on a traffic stop near 96th St and A St. They started heading south on Pacific Ave S and heard more mic clicks. He heard Officer Burbank scream out 96th and Ainsworth. He knew Officers Burbank and Collins were incredibly trained and this scream concerned him. As they were headed on 96th St S he could see the amber lights on the patrol vehicle. He could see dark figures near the front of the patrol vehicle as they approached. They stopped and exited their patrol vehicle.

He could see Manuel lifting up as Officer Burbank was on his back and Officer Collins had his legs. Manuel was pushing them off. He went to control one of Manuel's legs. He noticed Manuel was handcuffed at the time. He described Manuel as screaming incoherently and he told him to relax. He told him to just breath and relax. He heard more sirens and continued to hold onto his legs. Sgt Lim arrived and eventually Manuel was put into the hobble restraints. Once he was in restraints, he told Manuel he was going to be okay and needed to relax. He said "So I remember, I think it was Sergeant Lim, calling for Fire to respond and we're still holdin' on this whole time, like talking to him. Like hey man, you need to remain calm. You need to remain calm. You need to remain calm. And the sus, the subject did not appear to like be in distress or anything. Like he wasn't saying like, there was no labored breathing or screaming. He just kinda like screaming incoherently, I'm like I don't even really recall what he was trying to say. But what I do remember is that he said I can't breathe. But it wasn't like you know how when someone says I can't breathe and they're like it sounds like they can't breathe, it didn't sound like that. He said it in a remarkable calm fashion."

He and Officer Rankin relieved Officers Collins and Burbank. He said they looked gassed. He pulled out the taser probes and put them in a plastic bag. He turned over the plastic bag to Sgt Rock. Officer Rankin was still holding Manuel in the recovery position. He told Manuel to look at him and breath. Officer Rankin checked his pulse and noticed it was low and he was burning up. He thought this could be exited delirium. He remembered saying that the Fire Department needed to step it up. He ran over to Fire and told him Manuel was unresponsive and thought it was exited delirium. The handcuffs and hobble restraints were removed as the Fire Department treated Manuel. He had not delivered any strikes and was not hit by Manuel.

He began his canvassing in the neighborhood. He noticed some people on the porch at 1438 96th St S. He noticed a doorbell camera on their residence. They said that they had not seen anything. The homeowner showed him the footage from the camera. He could see the amber lights from the patrol vehicle and inaudible screaming. He could not see much since it was on a small screen. He obtained the

homeowners contact information. I later passed this information onto Detective Helmcke and this was the residence he obtained the footage from.

He talked about how they confirmed Manuel's identity through the fingerprint scanner, photos and tattoos. He described the temperature that night as 45-50 degrees, windy and rainy. He talked about the intermittent streetlights in the area. He did not recognize Manuel from any previous contacts. I asked him some details about how Manuel was positioned when he said he could not breathe. He said he was on his stomach and then he went into the recovery position. I talked with him about his excited delirium training. He had taken a course on during on board training. He thought he had seen it exhibited on at least two other people he dealt with in the past. We asked him a few more follow up questions about the Fire Department. He thought they started CPR within a few moments of arriving.

Over the course of the investigation I requested the Fire Records for this incident including the radio traffic. I had the radio traffic transcribed. See the following transcript;

DIS DISPATCH, TFD TACOME FIRE DISPATCH, REC RECORDING, E10 ENGINE 10, T2 TOWER 2, M1 MEDIC 1, MAR MARLIN FROM ENGINE 10, UNK UNKNOWN, TPD TACOMA POLICE PERSONNEL
DIS Hey, can we get you guys out to South 96th and Ainsworth for an eval?

TFD Sure. What's going on there?

DIS Yeah, looks like we are fighting with somebody there.

TFD Okay.

DIS We don't have much more than that.

TFD All right. We'll get a crew right out there.

DIS Okay. Thank you.

REC Engine 10, Channel A-2, ALS, injury, South 96th Street and Ainsworth Avenue South. Engine 10, Channel A-2, ALS, injury, South 96th Street and Ainsworth Avenue South. Time 2326.

(Unintelligible).

DIS Hey, just updating at 96th and Ainsworth. They're gonna need an ambulance as well, somebody's restrained on a backboard.

TFD All right, we'll advise our crews. Thank you.

DIS Okay, thank you.

TFD Bye.

E10 Patrol, Engine 10.

TFD Go ahead Engine 10.

E10 If you want to upgrade to ALS for excited delirium.

TFD Received Engine 10. Engine 10, ALS upgrade, 2335.

REC Medic One, Channel A-2, ALS, injury, South 96th Street and Ainsworth Avenue South. Medic One, Channel A-2, ALS, injury, South 96th Street and Ainsworth Avenue South. Time 2336.

TFD Engine 10, you have Medic One from quarters.

E10 Received, Medic One.

TFD Medic One, ALS upgrade with Engine 10 on scene for excitable delirium, 2336.

E10 (Unintelligible).

E10 Tacoma, Engine 10.

TFD Go Engine 10.

E10 Can you start another ALS company, CPR in progress.

TFD Received. We'll start, get you extra company for CPR. Engine 10, you're gonna have Tower 2 from Quarters.

E10 Received.

REC Tower 2, Channel A-2, cardiac arrest, South 96th Street and Ainsworth Avenue South. Tower 2, Channel A-02, cardiac arrest, South 96th Street and Ainsworth Avenue South. Time 2338.

T2 Received, Tower 2.

TFD Medic One, did you copy? CPR now in progress with Engine 10. Tower 2 as well.

DIS Tower 2 join Engine 10, Medic One enroute for CPR in progress. Tower 2 join Engine 10, Medic One enroute for CPR. 2320, 2339.

UNK CPR (unintelligible).

M1 Medic one, we did receive that.

DIS 2339.

E10 Engine 10, Tower 2's arriving.

T2 Medic One, Tower 2, when you do arrive, park to the South side of Tower 2. Patient is directly in front of Tower 2.

M1 Medic One received, south side.
E10 Tacoma, Engine 10, this is confirmed Signal 3. TPD will be contacting medical.
DIS Received Engine 10. Signal 3. Signal 3 called at 0019.
TPD Dispatch, hey, for the 9th and Ainsworth, did you guys get a body core temperature on the subject there or a blood sample?
DIS That I do not know, I can, I can get back to you on that.
TPD Okay, yeah, could you?
DIS Sure.
TPD Thank you, appreciate it.
DIS Okay, bye.
DIS Engine 10, could you call GFC, landline.
E-10 Received.
MAR Marlin, Engine 10.
DIS Hey Marlin, hey, police called, wanted to know if, and I talked to Medic One also about this, but did you guys record any kind of core temperature for that gentleman that passed away? Body core temperature? Do you know?
MAR Did you record a core temperature?
DIS By chance?
MAR No.
DIS Did you take any blood samples, like, anything like that? Maybe a (unintelligible).
MAR No blood samples.
DIS I'll let 'em know. No (unintelligible). All right Marlin, I appreciate it.
MAR All right.
DIS Bye, have a good night.
MAR Bye.
DIS Hey, reference the signal 3 on 96th Street, about the blood samples?
TPD Yeah.
DIS No blood samples were taken and no core temperature was taken at the time.
TPD Okay. Can they go back and do that?
DIS Yeah, I think they can. I think we have a medic that can go do that, yeah.
TPD Okay.
DIS Are you guys requesting...
TPD Thank you.
DIS them back on the scene right now?
TPD Yeah, that's...
DIS Okay.
TPD that's the request from the Lieutenant...
DIS Okay. All right.
TPD at least.
DIS Sounds, sounds good. Okay.
TPD Appreciate it.
DIS Yup.
TFD Tacoma Fire Dispatch.
JUL Hi, this is Julie with American Medical Response...
TFD Hey, ...
JUL on a recorded line. How you doin'.
TFD Good.
JUL Hey, I just wanted to give you a call about the (unintelligible). I know it was a little bit ago, that we picked up from 4023 South Lawrence Street.
TFD Um-hm.
JUL We took a patient over to St. Joe's Medical Center.
TFD Okay, thank you.
JUL No problem. Thanks.
E10 Engine 10, Tacoma.
DIS Hey, this is Shawn at Dispatch. Hey, TPD, TPD is requesting you back on scene to take a core temperature and a blood sample. Yeah, I understand. I'm just telling you what TPD wants, so no...
E10 Yeah, we can, we can go back there.

DIS You wanna go back out there and then...
E10 Sure.
DIS Yeah, we'll get a medic goin' too I guess. If you guys can't do...
E10 Well, you're fine, we'll figure it out.

DIS Hey, the signal 3 on 96th Street, we have Engine 10 responding back out there.
E10 E-10, can you reassign us to the previous event.
TFD Received 0039.

On 03-10-20 at around 0938 hours, I called Theresa Odel Williams. She had lived in the same residence as Manuel and had stopped by the front desk to ask about his belongings on behalf of his family. It was a shared residence with several individual rooms. She said Manuel went to church the night of the incident at Last Day Ministry at 11th and J St. He played the drums at church. She saw him earlier in the day at around 1845 hours. She provided me the address of where they were living of 1815 102nd St S. Kimberly Mayes was the manager of the house program named "God's Hands Up" similar to a clean and sober residence. Kimberly lived upstairs and Manuel had a room downstairs. Manuel had moved into this residence a month ago. He had lived in another house owned by Kimberly on S 43rd. She had not much interaction with him. She thought he had attended a treatment program in the past. She mentioned he was always in bed and came alive at night going out. She thought he was on psych medication and would sleepwalk sometimes. She last heard him in his room at around 2130-2200 hours that night after returning from church. She mentioned his roommate was Mendel Emerson who was a drug addict. Manuel liked to walk to the 7-11 at 96th/Steele. Det/Sgt Loeffelholz had been in contact with both 7-11's in the area to see if there was video of him from that night. She provided me a phone number for Manuel's sister Monica. She had talked to another person at the house named "Isaiah" who told her Manuel was evil.

On 03-12-20 at around 1248 hours, Detective Helmcke and I arrived at 1815 102nd St S where Manuel had been living. I had set up a time to interview Kimberly Mayes the manager. We first spoke with Cedric Armstrong Kimberly's husband who also is a manager. They both agreed to conduct a recorded interview. Cedric started and then Kimberly came into the interview later. The following is a summary of the interview. See the transcript for details.

He called the transitional house God's Hands and talked about the second one at 43rd and Pacific. He had lived in this residence for a year and the one on 43rd for 5 years. He said they were trying to get to the point that they were regulated by the State. Manuel had stayed at this residence for 3 months and at the residence on 43rd for 1.5 months. He added that Manuel had been going to Pierce County Alliance (PCA) for UA's drug/alcohol treatment. The UA's were random. I asked him how Manuel was as a client. He said he was great. He added that Manuel was one of his best tenants. He kept his room clean and did his chores. He mentioned Manuel tackled another tenant who had tried to stab Cedric at the 43rd St residence. Manuel got a cut on his hand from the incident. TPD came out and the tenant was arrested. Manuel also joined their church called Last Days Ministries at 11th/"J" St. He talked about Manuel being a drummer. He talked about Manuel being on medication that made him sleepwalk. He said sometimes the meds make him restless. He heard from PCA that the medication could be for schizophrenia.

The night of the incident they went to Church until 2130 hours. He cooked food for Manuel when they got him. Manuel's roommate Mendel Everson was present as well. He gave Manuel some paper at 2230 hours. He did not see Manuel or Mendel leave. When he checked their room the next morning the TV was on and the video game chairs were set up. They got a call from Manuel's sister who had talked to the M.E. There was a second assess to the downstairs so he had not seen them leave that night. He heard that Mendel but not directly the he was not coming back and did not want his stuff. He mentioned Mendel used meth in the past. Kimberly added details about all the clean UA's of Manuel and that he was a great role model in class. She talked about the goals he had written on the paper that night. At a few points during the interview they both talked at the same time and it was hard to follow each person's statement. They did not have any issues with Manuel. She was trying to figure out what had occurred with Manuel. She heard from his sister that she listened to a video tape that Manuel said he could not breath twice. I believe she was referring to the surveillance video/audio the Det Helmcke collected from 1438 96th St S. She mentioned that he like to go to the 7-11 and get sacks at night. She mentioned Brian was one of his good friends but she did not have his number but thought PCA might. She added that Manuel had been clean and sober the entire time. She talked about some of the concerns she had about the case based on what she heard about Manuel saying that he could not breath. She said she could not imagine that he went

from the state he was in to beating on a police car. She also talked about the press release in the paper. She added that Manuel had a normal very enhanced great week.

She talked about a separate incident with Mendel (other roommate) where the police were called when he was screaming and out of it one night.

I asked them if the water and donuts found at the scene came from their house. They said no. I asked them what Manuel was recovering from. He used meth in the past. Cedric provided met with the contact information for Manuel's counselors at PCA. She later showed me a cell phone video of Manuel playing the drums in church. She described him as having a beautiful smile, very helpful and gentle. While I was there she called Mendel's mom Michelle to see if she could pass on her number and put her on speaker phone. She declined but I provided Kimberly a business card to pass onto Michelle to have her call me. I wanted to talk with Mendel about that night. I have not heard from her or Mendel. She thought Mendel had a warrant in Thurston County. I explained it was important for us to talk with him. I found Mendel Roi Everson in background with the DOB 04-23-85. Michelle is list as his mom/POC. I did locate a felony warrant and some misdemeanor warrants for his arrest.

She mentioned that Manuel volunteered for PCA and it was not through the courts. They had known Manuel for about 3-4 months total. She talked again about what she heard about the incident. She thought they should have stunned (tased) him. She thought he had been in a choke hold. Cedric showed us Manuel and Mendel's room. I took a photo of the room and the letter he wrote on my department phone which appeared to be a to do list. I uploaded those images onto the server. Nothing appeared out of the ordinary in his room.

I downloaded all the interviews and transcripts onto CD's. I placed the taser download forms, CD's and 911 radio traffic CD's from SS 911 into evidence at the PCSD/TPD main property room. Over the course of the investigation I had Detective Peterson contact Officer Collins and he photographed the hobble restraint used in the incident. These images were uploaded into the server.

Prior to my arrival, Sgt Lim (S092) advised units to slow their response, as PPO COLLINS and PPO BURBANK (H317) had one subject detained. They requested a hobble from responding units due to the subject being non-compliant and combative.

Upon arrival, I observed the subject (later identified as O/ELLIS) laying on the North side of the intersection of S 96th St/S Ainsworth, in front of H317's patrol vehicle. O/ELLIS was laying on his right side facing East, in handcuffs and a hobble. O/ELLIS was yelling while rocking his body back and forth, appearing to try and break free of his restraints. Multiple officers were surrounding him, controlling him so he wouldn't kick anyone. TFD was requested to conduct an evaluation on O/ELLIS due to a taser being deployed during the original fight with officers.

When TFD arrived on scene, O/ELLIS was still conscious and breathing. From TFD's walk from their engine located East of S Ainsworth to O/ELLIS's location, O/ELLIS suddenly went unconscious. TFD began CPR for approximately 40 minutes, attempting to revive him. O/ELLIS was pronounced deceased at 0020 hours.

The scene was secured by other officers.

I transported PPO COLLINS to 495 Shandon Wright Way S (PCSD Substation) under instructions from Sgt Lim.

I reported back to S 96th St/S Ainsworth Av for traffic control while PCSD conducted their investigation.

See other officers supplemental reports for details regarding this incident. This concluded my involvement in this incident.

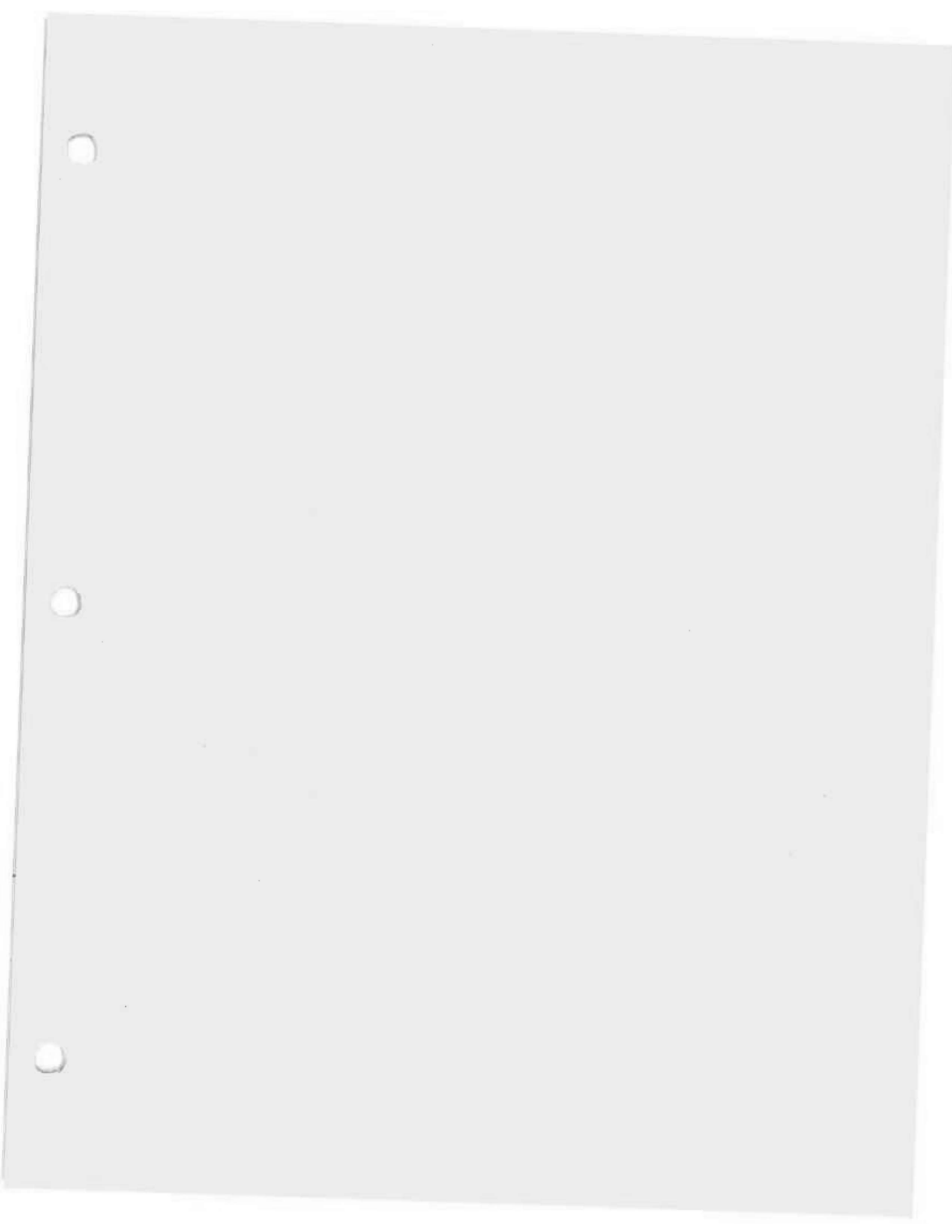
We arrived at approximately 2325 hours. I observed a male subject, later identified as O/MANUEL ELLIS, lying on his back detained in hand/foot restraints. O/ELLIS was breathing heavily and shouting. He appeared to be pulling at the restraints.

TFD arrived at approximately 2334 hours and requested the restraints to be removed. At this time I moved closer to O/ELLIS to assist TFD as they began administering aid. I heard TFD say "he will code soon" and PPO Rankine and I asked what we could do. Per TFD request, I began CPR on O/ELLIS, switching off with PPO Rankine as necessary. O/ELLIS appeared unconscious at this point. We continued the CPR until more TFD showed up and took over all aid efforts within a few minutes.

I cleared the scene shortly after O/ELLIS was pronounced deceased on scene and a crime scene log was established by PPO Madden.

Narrative: On 03.03.2020 I was working uniformed patrol for the City of Tacoma as unit P241. I was operating a fully marked Tacoma Police vehicle.

At approximately 2322 hours I was parked in the 3 sector substation - 1501 S 72 St, Tacoma WA. I was writing an unrelated police report when I heard Tacoma unit H317 (Officers Burbank and Collins) yell out 96 and Ainsworth, followed on by radio microphone clicks and further unreadable yelling. Based on training and experience, I believed that unit H317 was in a potentially dangerous situation and needed priority back up.

I responded priority to S 96 and S Ainsworth. I was traveling behind unit S171 (Sgt G. Rock). Behind me, was unit U285 (Officer Brahs). I arrived on scene right behind unit S171.

I observed the subject on the ground, on his back/side. The subject was already handcuffed and his legs were also restrained, behind his back. I observed that another officer was trying to keep him on the ground as he was very tensed up and it appeared was trying to move. I assisted that officer by placing my knees, hands and body weight on the subjects legs and held them there (to prevent the subject from further moving, injuring himself and /or other officers).

I assisted other officers with rolling the subject onto his stomach.

It was past the end of my shift and I had another report to complete (my shift ends at 2300 hours). The scene appeared to be under control with the subject restrained.

I cleared the scene and responded back to the 3 substation to finish my report (I was only on scene for approximately 5 minutes before leaving). At approximately 2355 hours I was complete. I drove home for the night and just prior to arriving, I over heard on the radio that the subject had passed away.

I called unit S092 (Sgt Lim). I advised Sgt Lim of my actions on scene as previously described. Sgt Lim instructed me to respond back to the city and to remain on the scene.

I responded back to the city and remained on scene. I advised Sgt G. Rock of my actions. Sgt G. Rock cleared me shortly after and requested I stay and assist with handling pending patrol calls.

I cleared the scene and later wrote this statement.

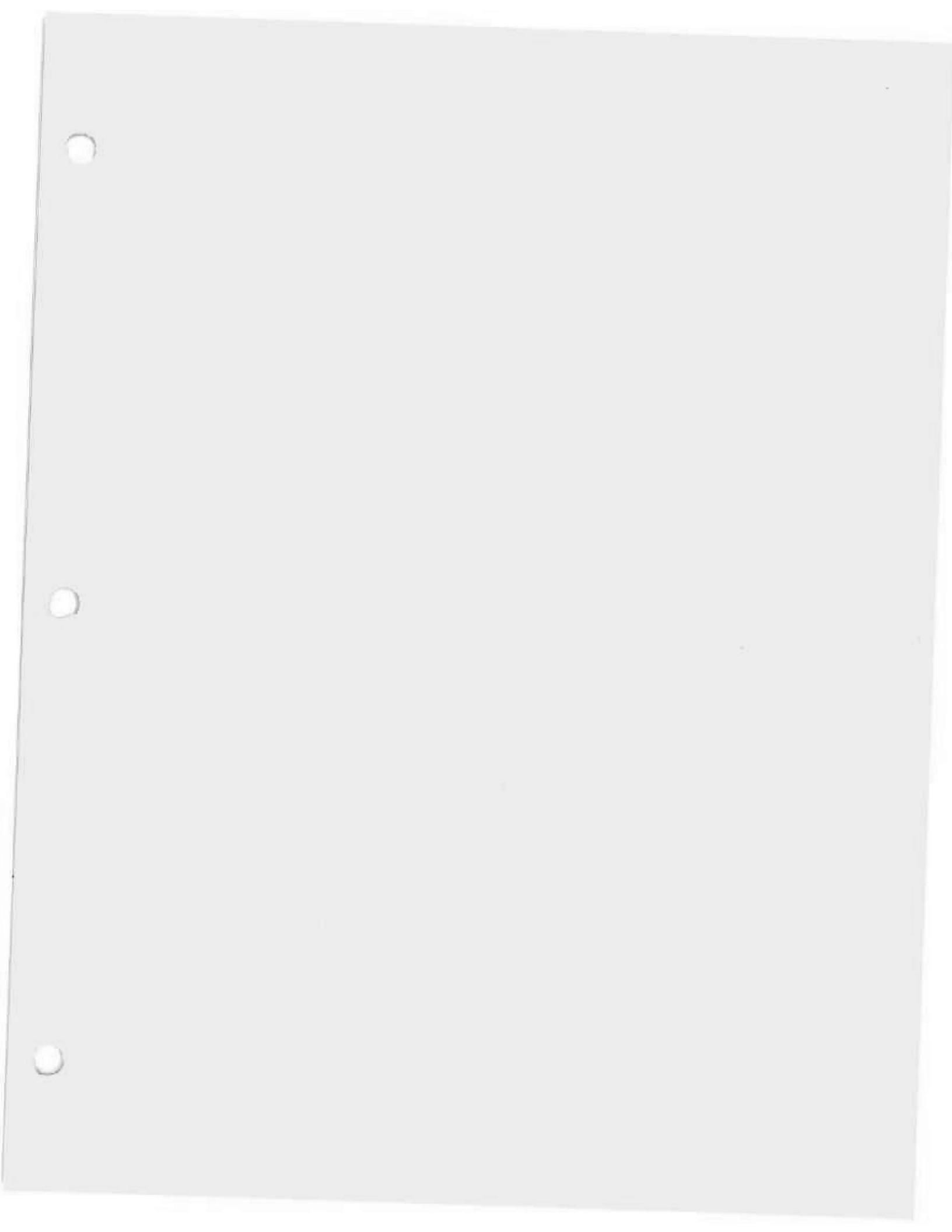

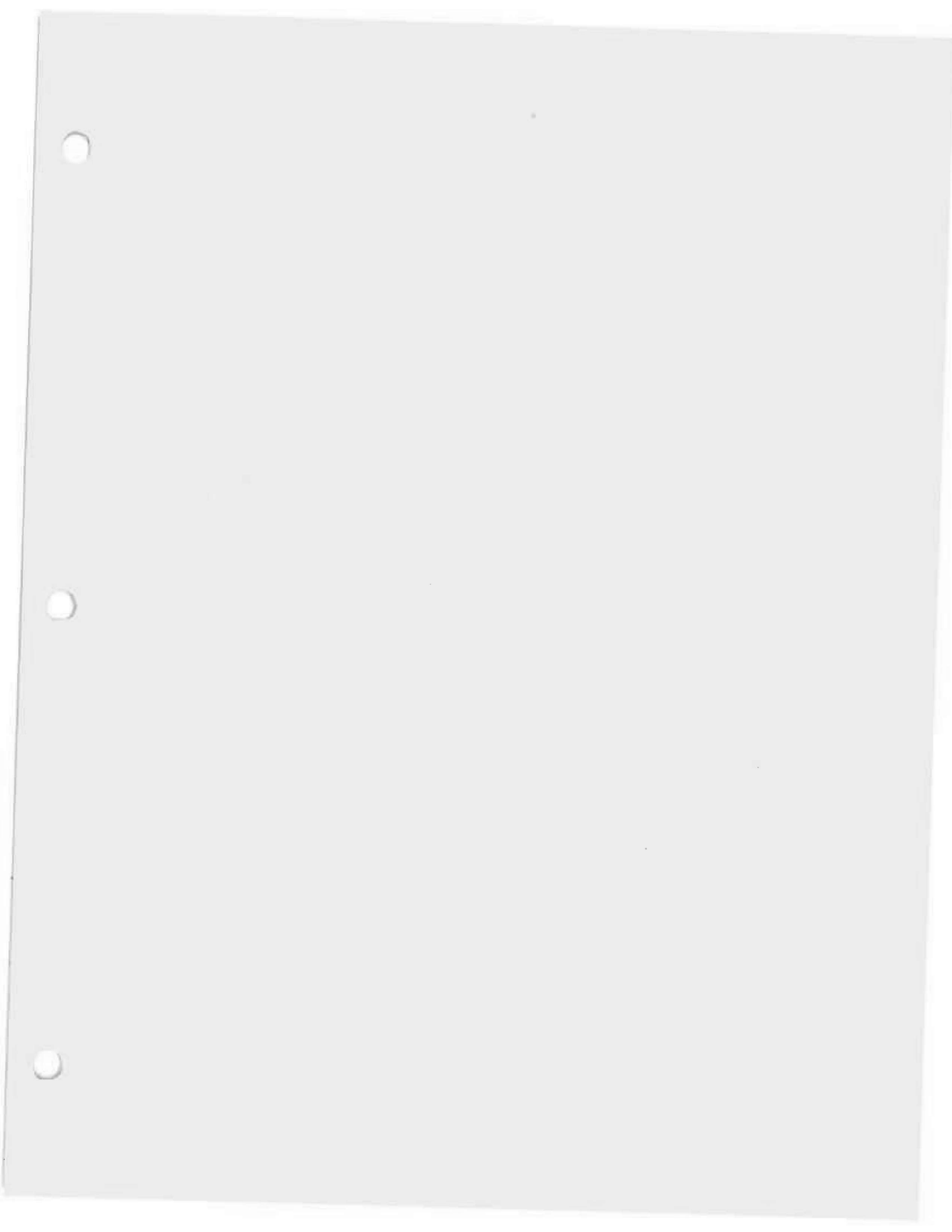

Narrative:

On 03/03/2020 at around 2322 hours I (Sergeant Rock) heard H317 (PPO's Collins and Burbank) call for priority backup in the area of S 96th and Ainsworth St. I responded to their location. Just prior to my arrival I heard over the radio that they had one detained and incoming units could slow. I arrived on scene around 2325 hours. Tacoma Fire Department personnel were requested by officers on scene.

Upon arrival I saw a male, later identified as Manuel E Ellis, on his stomach. Ellis was handcuffed and had his legs hobbled. Ellis was screaming and attempting to roll around. Officers Burbank, Collins, Rankine, and Ford were holding him in place so that he could not thrash around.

After a while Ellis began to calm down. At this time only officer Rankine was holding him down. He then began to make a grunting or growling type sound. Ellis then became silent. Officers rolled the male onto his side. Tacoma Fire Department personnel arrived on scene and began to evaluate the male. Fire personnel asked for the male to be un-cuffed so they could put an IV in, which was done. A short time later fire personnel stated that CPR needed to be done on the male. I observed Tacoma Fire Department members and PPO's Rankine and Warner providing CPR to Ellis. At around 0012 hours Ellis was pronounced dead by Tacoma Fire Department.

I then assured that the scene was secured and a crime scene log was started by PPO Madden. Sgt Lim who was also on scene made contact with Lt Mueller who responded to the scene.

Officers Burbank, Collins, Ford, and Rankine were all transported to a Pierce County Sheriff's Office sub station to be interviewed. Sgt Lim also responded out to the Pierce County sub station.

It was determined that due to the death being an in custody death Pierce County Sheriff's Office would conduct the investigation. I made sure that the scene stay secured and turned over the scene to Pierce County Sheriffs Office once they arrived on scene.

Narrative:

On 3-3-20 at approximately 2322 hours, I heard over the radio that an officer yelled out the location of "S. 96th and Ainsworth" with no further communication. This radio traffic was followed by additional mic clicks from the officer. Dispatch repeated the location and advised that it was from the 2-officer unit H317, Officer Burbank and Officer Collins. Upon hearing this, I responded emergency to the location. Based on my experience, when an officer transmits mic clicks on their radio they are typically in a physical altercation with someone. Dispatch attempted to get a response from Officer Burbank and Officer Collins but received no answer.

I was heading EB on S. 96th Street when I arrived on scene at approximately 2324 hours and confirmed the location to dispatch. At the intersection of Ainsworth Ave, I observed Officer Burbank, Officer Collins, Officer Ford, and Officer Rankine attempting to hold down a male subject on the north side of the intersection in the street. I observed that the subject was on his stomach with the top of his head facing SB. I saw that the subject was handcuffed but was attempting to kick his legs around. At one point, I observed the subject nearly get up on his knees. He appeared to have extraordinary strength give the fact that multiple officers were trying to hold him down. An officer then retrieved a leg-restraint strap that was placed on the subject's feet to prevent him from kicking his legs at them and getting up. I observed that the subject was sweating profusely.

I advised dispatch at approximately 2325 hours that we needed TFD to respond to the scene immediately to medical assess to the subject. Based on the subject's actions, I believed that he could possibly be under a state of excited delirium. I also requested an ambulance to the scene. TFD arrived on scene and began rendering medical aid to the subject.

I then contacted Officer Burbank and Officer Collins and asked them what occurred. Both Officer Burbank and Officer Collins advised me that they were stopped at a traffic light at the intersection facing WB. They advised that they suddenly observed the subject in the street near them attempting to get into an unknown vehicle that was passing through the intersection. The subject then came over the front passenger side of their marked patrol vehicle and suddenly punched the passenger side window. Officer Burbank and Officer Collins said that they exited the patrol vehicle to contact the subject when the subject immediately began swinging his fists toward them, striking them both multiple times to include in the face. The subject continued to assault the officers as they attempted to take him into custody by punching and kicking them. Officer Burbank advised me that he was able to deploy his Taser toward the subject that appeared to be effective until the Taser cycle ended. The subject then continued his assaultive actions toward the officers until they were able to get him on the ground and secured in handcuffs.

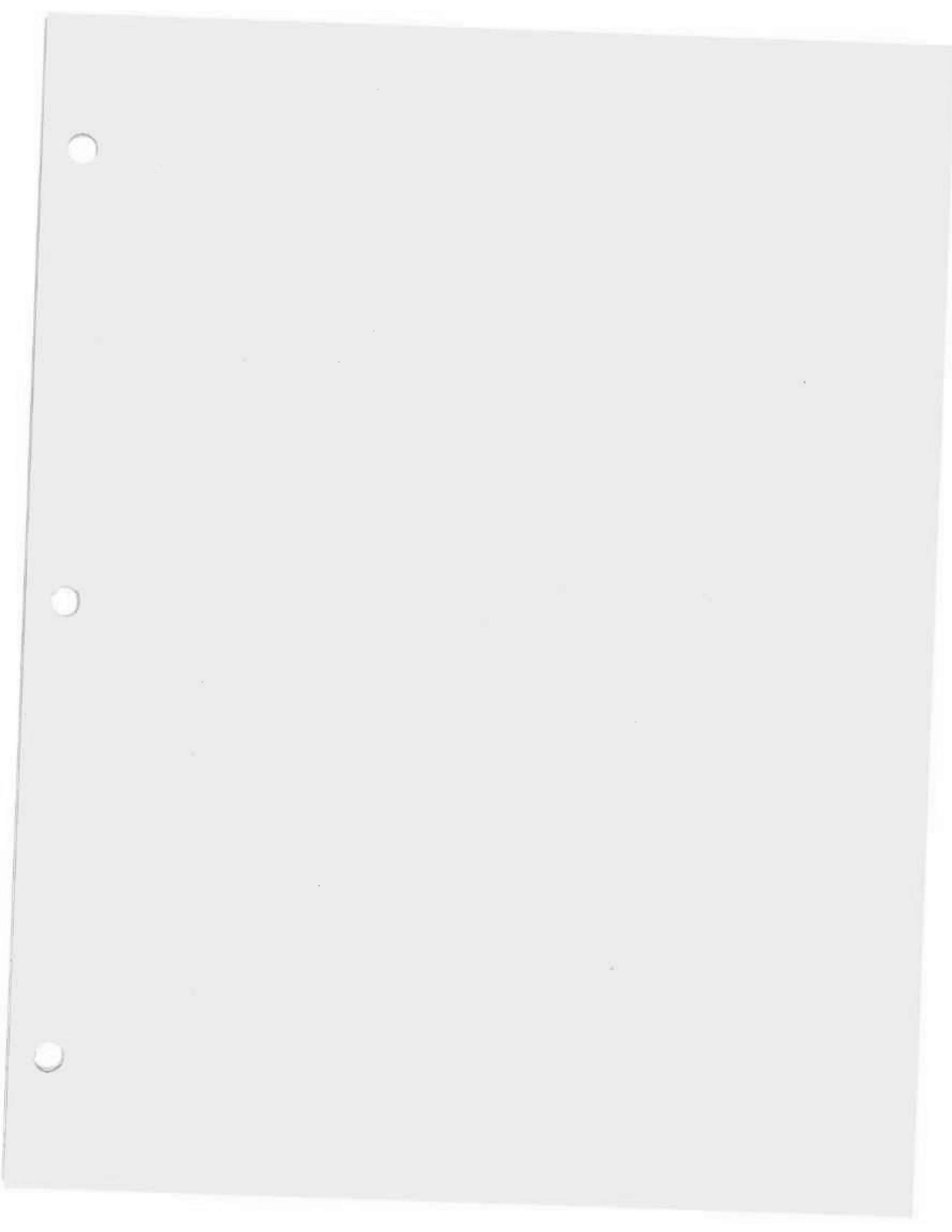
The subject soon became unresponsive as he was being treated by TFD. I then observed TFD begin to perform CPR on the subject for some time. At this point, I contacted the shift commander Lt. Mueller and advised her of the incident. Lt. Mueller then responded to the scene.

I advised Officer Hightower, Officer Derr, and Officer Schneider to contact the neighboring residences for any possible witness information. I also asked dispatch if any callers reported this subject as a suspicious person in the area prior to the incident to which they had none.

I was then advised by Lt. Mueller to coordinate transporting Officer Burbank and Officer Collins to the Pierce County Sheriff's Department Spanaway precinct as the Sheriff's Department was going to perform the investigation. Officer Ford and Officer Rankine soon arrived to this location as well. I had all four officers separated in different rooms at the precinct while they awaited peer support and union representatives. I advised each of the officers not to discuss the incident among themselves or anyone else. This concludes my involvement in this incident.

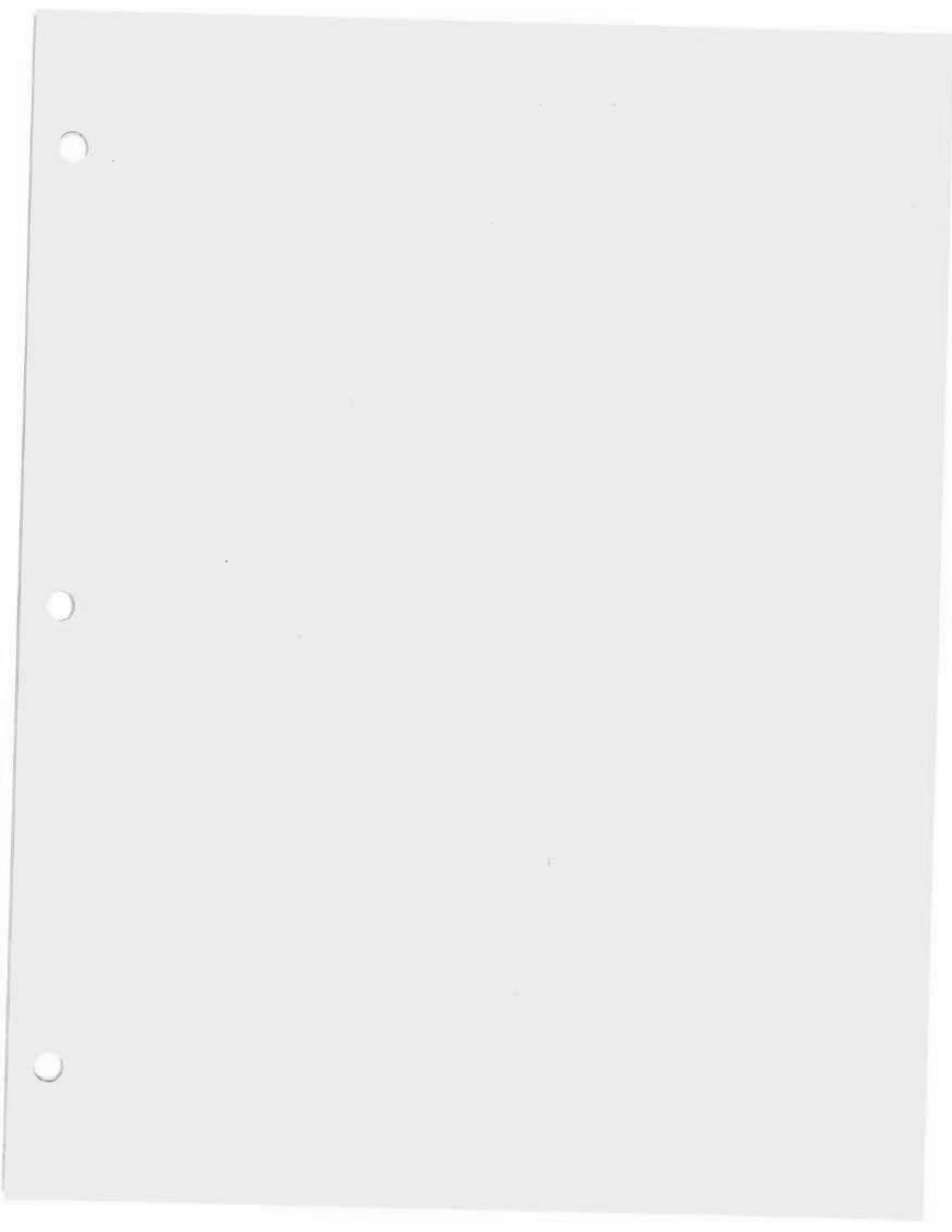

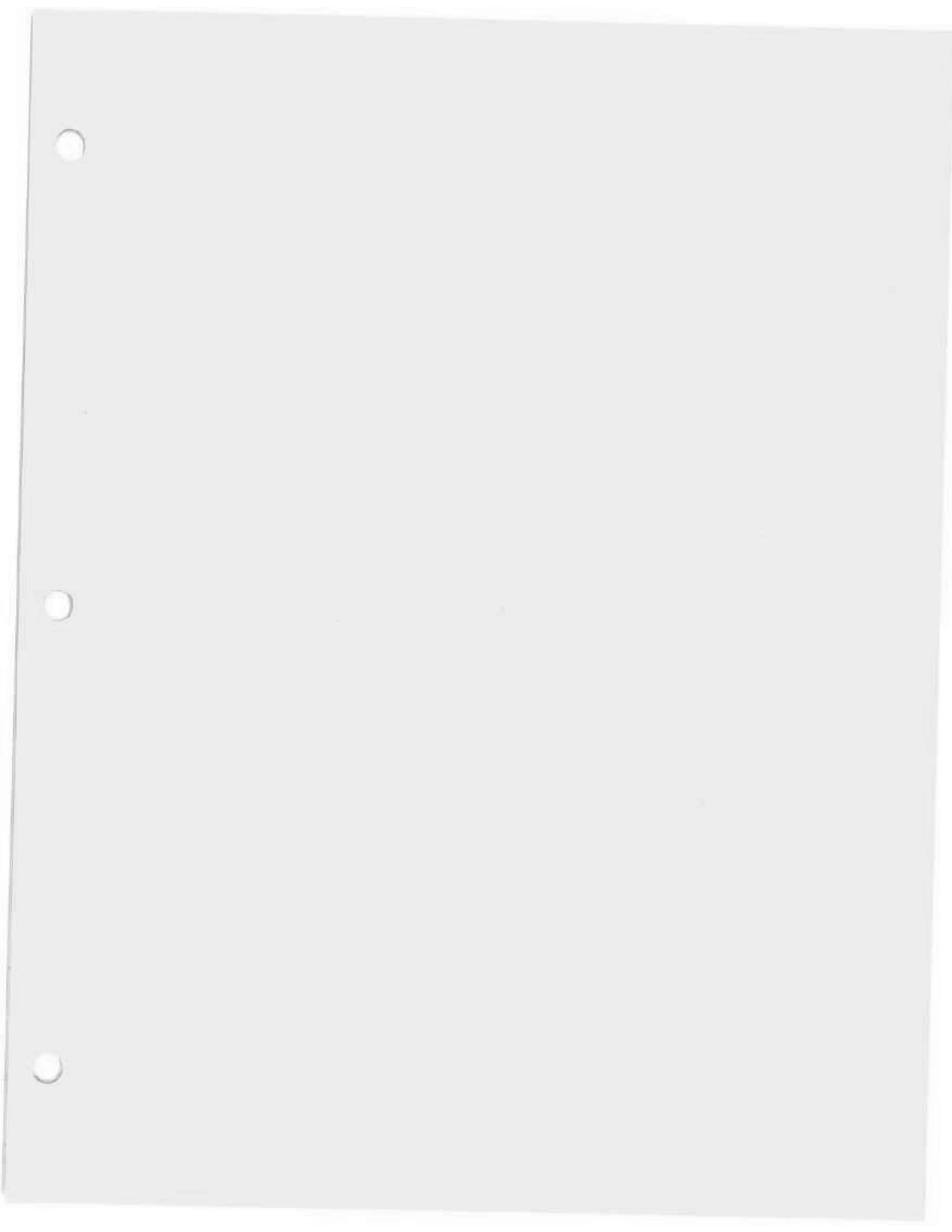

Narrative:	<p>On March 3, 2020 I was working as the night shift commander for the Tacoma Police Department in the City of Tacoma, Washington. At approximately 2322 hours I heard a distress call over my portable radio which sounded like an officer was in a struggle. There were several mic clicks and muffled voices. After a few seconds PPO Burbank got on the radio and yelled out the street name "Ainsworth" but no cross street.</p> <p>I had been working in my office at Headquarters when the call came in. I began to pack up my computer and head out of the office when PPO Burbank was able to confirm his location in the 9600 block. Shortly after that Sgt Lim got on the air and slowed all incoming units down, confirming they had a person detained. At that time I also heard Sgt Rock arrive on scene. Knowing things were in capable hand I returned to HQ.</p> <p>Approximately 20 minutes later Sgt Lim called me and informed me that the individual they had detained was now experiencing a medical emergency and that TFD was on scene providing life saving measures via CPR. I was surprised to hear this information since it appeared that he had the scene under control and the suspect was in custody. Sgt Lim explained that the individual, later identified as Manual Ellis, had been exhibiting classic signs of excited delirium when officers drove up upon him in the middle of the street trying to get into an occupied vehicle. They stopped, rolled down their window to address him and he attacked them out of nowhere. He said that Ellis had punched one of the officers in the face and picked up and threw the other officer. He said the officers were grappling with Ellis on the ground while he continued to fight and resist them. As additional officers, from multiple agencies, arrived they were able to get him into custody and stabilize the situation.</p> <p>He said Ellis was alert and talking to the officers for several minutes before he began to show signs of medical distress. Sgt Lim asked repeatedly for the fire department to expedite their response recognizing the signs of a medical emergency.</p>

I immediately responded to the location. When I arrived Mr. Ellis had been declared deceased by TFD. I immediately made my notification to the chain of command via Capt. Hayes. I informed him of the incident and he said he would contact A/C Gustason. I then made a call to Lt Karl of internal affairs to notify him of the situation. I remained on scene until I was relieved by Captain Hayes and PCSO CID. While waiting for them to respond I was told that TFD failed to take a body core temp and blood sample from Ellis, which is customary in excited delirium cases. I requested TFD to return and take the samples. Approximately 40 minutes post mortem, Ellis had a body temp of 96.7 degrees.

Once the scene was handed over to PCSO CID I responded to the PCSO substation on Pacific Ave to wait for the officers involved to be photographed, initially interviewed and released. I remained on scene until approximately 0404 hours when all officers were released.

Death Investigation

This memo to file is written in response to the request from the Washington State Patrol (WSP) in regards to my actions taken on March 4, 2020 at the intersection of S. 96th/Ainsworth Ave., Tacoma, WA.

On March 4, 2020, I was notified via my departmental phone of an Officer Involved Death Investigation. This incident occurred in the intersection of S. 96th/Ainsworth Ave., Tacoma, WA. I arrived at the location at approximately 0133 hours. I contacted Lt. J. Mueller who was the on scene shift commander for the Tacoma Police Department. Lt. J. Mueller introduced me to Sgt. B. Brockway of the Pierce County Sheriff's Department. Sgt. B. Brockway would be the primary investigator for the incident. Sgt. B. Brockway briefed Sgt. GJ Roberts and myself of the preliminary investigation and escorted us through the crime scene.

No law enforcement or criminal investigation was conducted on my part. I cleared the scene at approximately 0302 hours.

I am an Internal Affairs (IA) Investigator Sergeant for the Tacoma Police Department. On March 4, 2020, I received a phone call from IA Lieutenant Chris Karl regarding an officer involved in-custody death. As part of the internal investigation process, I responded to the area of South 96th and Ainsworth in Tacoma where the incident occurred. I arrived and met with IA Lieutenant Chris Karl at around 0135 hours. Several other PCSO and TPD officers were there. PCSO Detective Sergeant Byron Brockway had been assigned the lead criminal investigator for the independent investigation. He explained what was known at that time and briefly guided us through the scene. I observed the decedent laying on the north side of the street and the locations of various police vehicles.

I was not part of the criminal investigation. At that time, I did not interview any citizen witnesses or collect any evidence. I cleared the scene at around 0300 hours.
