Urban Tree Sale

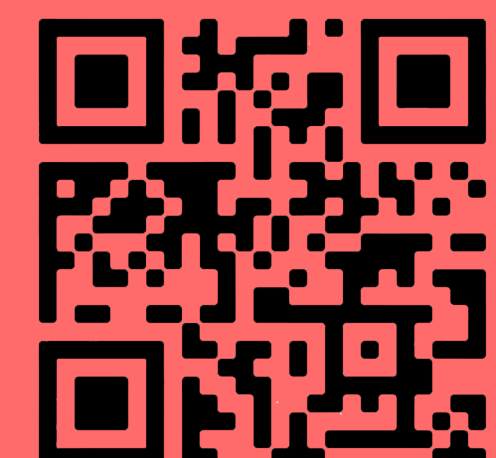
Aims to help residents in Tacoma, Puyallup, and unincorporated Pierce County receive discounted trees.

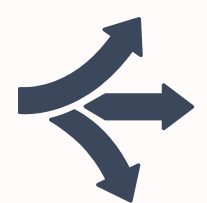

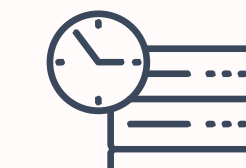
