City Manager's Office

Presentations and Discussions

Charter Review Committee Presentation

- 6:19 Andre Jimenez shared about the work of the Charter Review Committee's workgroup on
 policing accountability with Melissa Malott and Latasha Palmer. This included overview of
 recommendations related to policing accountability, background on how the recommendations
 were developed, and next steps with the recommendations.
- Mayor Woodards discussed the council process and considerations for charter review this year.
- Members discussed the potential position to support CPAC and clarified it has been put on hold until more is known including which recommendations will go on the ballot and form of government.
- Louis asked how CPAC will be kept apprised, and Mayor Woodards shared that it is expected
 that the Council will discuss the recommendations related to policing accountability at the June
 4 study session. Mayor Woodards affirmed that all decisions and discussion will be public
 including the two Friday meeting which will be audio recorded.
- On July 9, there will be a public hearing where community members can provide input however community members can provide input at any time via email.
- Melissa encouraged CPAC members or anyone with questions to visit the charter review committee website to find presentations and additional resources.

Sally shared that the collective bargaining agreement should remove the subordination clause which states that it outranks the City charter. Sally encouraged members to review former Chief Hairston's allegations related to his experience working with TPD. Sally also shared gratitude to CPAC for all their work.
