Homicide Investigation and Arrest – 2100 block of South “C” Street

Tacoma, WA – On August 25, 2024, at approximately 11:00 AM, the Tacoma Police Department responded to [2100 South “C” Street](#) regarding a possible deceased male. Upon arrival, officers were directed to an unresponsive adult male and immediately began life-saving measures. The Tacoma Fire Department arrived on scene and pronounced the victim deceased.

Detectives and [Crime Scene Technicians](#) responded and investigated the incident as a homicide.

Through the course of the investigation, probable cause for the arrest of two suspects was developed. On Tuesday, September 17, 2024, members of the Tacoma Police Criminal Investigations Division and Special Investigations Section took the suspects into custody without incident. Both suspects were booked into the Pierce County Jail for the charges of Murder in the First Degree and Robbery in the First Degree. An additional charge of Unlawful Possession of a Firearm was added the booking charges of one of the suspects.

Tacoma, Wash. – Today, Detectives made an arrest in the homicide that occurred September 23, 2024. Just before 5:00 AM, the Tacoma Police Department responded to 1200 E 25th Street regarding a possible deceased male. Upon arrival, officers located an unresponsive adult male and immediately began life-saving measures. The Tacoma Fire Department arrived on scene and pronounced the fifty-year-old victim deceased.

Detectives established probable cause to arrest a forty-two-year-old woman. On Wednesday, September 25, 2024, at approximately 12:30 p.m., the suspect was located in the 1500 block of East 26th Street. The suspect taken into custody without incident and arrested for the offense of Murder in the First Degree

This remains an active investigation.

Just before 1:30 a.m., Tacoma Police responded to a trail near the 1900 block of South Mullen Street on a report of a person shot. When officers arrived, they found an adult male in his early twenties suffering from gunshot wounds. Officers attempted life-saving measures until relieved by Tacoma Fire Department personnel, but the victim succumbed to his wounds.

Crime Scene Technicians and Detectives responded to the scene and investigated the incident as a homicide.

On October 3, 2024, probable cause was developed for the arrest of a homicide suspect. With the assistance of the Homeless Outreach Team, the suspect was located and taken into custody without incident on Friday, October 4, 2024. The adult male suspect was booked into the Pierce County Jail for the offense of Murder in the First Degree.

Arrest Made in the Homicide Investigation – 2900 Block of Upper Park Street

Tacoma, Wash. – On September 9, 2023, at 1:00 a.m., the Tacoma Fire Department responded to the report of a brush fire in the 2900 block of Upper Park Street. Upon extinguishing the fire, they discovered the remains of a deceased individual in the debris. Tacoma Police Detectives and Crime Scene Technicians arrived at the scene and started their investigation into case.

During the course of the investigation, it was determined that this case was a homicide and a suspect was identified. On August 27, 2024, an adult male in his 40's was arrested in connection with this case and booked into the Pierce County Jail for Homicide by Controlled Substance.

This remains an active investigation.

Tacoma, Wash. – At approximately 1:30 a.m. on January 25, 2024, Tacoma Police officers responded to an address in the 4400 block of East Portland Avenue on a report of a shooting. Upon arrival, officers located a sixteen-year-old male suffering from gunshot wounds. Responding officers rendered medical aid until the victim could be transported to a local hospital.

On January 31, 2024, the victim succumbed to injuries directly related to the aggravated assault. The case was investigated as a homicide.

Through the course of the investigation, a suspect was identified on September 6, 2024. A warrant for Murder in the First Degree was issued for his arrest by the Pierce County Juvenile Court at Remann Hall. On September 16, 2024, with the assistance of the King County Sheriff's Office, a fifteen-year-old male suspect was taken into custody. He will be transported to Pierce County Juvenile Court.

Arrest Made in June 18th Homicide Case in Tacoma

Tacoma, WA – June 26, 2024 – The Tacoma Police Department has made an arrest in connection with the homicide that occurred on June 18, 2024, at approximately 11:30 PM in the 3200 block of East F Street.

Upon responding to reports of possible gunshots, officers found an unresponsive adult male and immediately began life-saving measures. The Tacoma Fire Department arrived on the scene and pronounced the victim deceased. Detectives and Crime Scene Technicians have been actively investigating this incident as a homicide.

On June 25, 2024, a 19-year-old male was charged in connection with this case. He has been charged with Murder in the 2nd Degree and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm in the 1st Degree.

The Tacoma Police Department extends its gratitude to the community for their cooperation and support during this investigation. We continue to encourage anyone with additional information related to this case to come forward and assist in the ongoing investigation.
