GROUP NORMS


Discussion guidelines for our work together:

- Respect each other's time. As much as possible, please be on time, attend meetings, and come prepared. Listen to each other for understanding.
- Take space, make space. Share your ideas, then step back to actively listen. If you're talkative, remember to step back; if you're quiet, remember to step up.
- Expect the best. When someone says something, assume the best intentions; ask clarifying questions. And keep in mind that sometimes impact is different than intent.
- Apply a trauma-informed framework. Recognize past harm and ground our work in principles of safety, trustworthiness/transparency, neighborhood strengths, peer support, collaboration, empowerment and choice, and cultural, historical, and gender issues. Allow space for reflection and healing.
- O Make room for messy, incomplete, and imperfect. There's no one right answer, and a final plan is not the end. Move at the speed of trust.
- Be positive and solution oriented. Keep moving forward. Be aware of what we can and cannot change.
- Know that you are valued. You are making a big contribution to the South Tacoma neighborhood – thank you!





WHAT IS VISION ZERO?

TRADITIONAL APPROACH

Traffic deaths are **INEVITABLE**

PERFECT human behaviour

Prevent **COLLISIONS**

INDIVIDUAL responsibility

Saving lives is **EXPENSIVE**

VISION ZERO

VS

Traffic deaths are **PREVENTABLE**

Integrate **HUMAN FAILING** in approach

Prevent FATAL AND SEVERE CRASHES

SYSTEMS approach

Saving lives is **NOT EXPENSIVE**

Tacoma City Council passed a Vision Zero Resolution in 2020

Tacoma's goal:

Zero traffic deaths and serious injuries by 2035

VISION ZERO AND THE SAFE SYSTEMS APPROACH

- Reduce kinetic energy slow drivers down
- Separate users in space and time
- Data-driven decision making
- Establish road safety as an equity issue


What is a Road Safety Audit?

- A formal safety performance review by an independent, multidiscplinary team
- Reports on potential road safety issues and identifies opportunities for improvement

Why perform a Road Safety Audit?

- High-risk corridors are complicated
- Need to understand the "system" before working towards the solution


Evidence of Speeding

TRANSPORTATION-LAND USE NEXUS

Compact, walkable, pedestrian-oriented urban places. They are places connected by public transit and active transportation networks. They anchor complete neighborhoods with retail stores and businesses (grocery stores, restaurants, markets, shops, etc.), civic amenities (libraries, schools, community centers, places of worship, etc.), housing options, health clinics, daycare centers, employment centers, plazas and parks, and other public gathering places. Mixed-use centers are the basis for achieving neighborhoods where residents can meet more of their everyday needs within an easy walk of their home.




