This happens through numerous interactions each season. Here are just a few highlights:

YOUTH ENGAGEMENT

- 22 meetings in schools awards ceremonies, sunrise readers, lockdown drills, lunch periods and more.
- 18 meetings outside of school at youth centers, Boys & Girls Clubs, sporting events, etc.
- 9 Explorer meetings, recruiting, and Winter Academy in Selah.
- Met with UW students on CPTED as a class project.
- Multiple Pioneer Youth Center meetings — diverting youth from the criminal justice system.
- Shop with a Cop and Toys for Tots events.



PROFESSIONALISM

- Attended 25 neighborhood meetings/council meetings and 20 Safe Streets meetings.
- Held 8 department training sessions including a 40-hour crisis intervention class, search & rescue, bicycle rapid response team, in-service pistol and electronic control tool training, child abduction response team and more.
- Improved collaboration through meetings with partner agencies like L & I Colloquium, Tacoma Mall Security, Tacoma Housing Authority, Liquor Control Board, Pierce County Health Department, Metro Parks and more.
- Provided safety awareness to multiple outside groups like the Thea Foss Waterway Association, Salon Academy,
 Tote Safety Fair, Boys & Girls Clubs, Tacoma Southeast Lions Club, Picasso Salon and held a Drug Take-Back Day.
