I. Call to Order

Co-Chair Stevens called the meeting to order at 5:31 pm.

II. Roll Call

CM J. Hill and Co-Chair Morris were absent.

III. Review of Minutes (April 17, 2024)

Last month's meeting minutes were not provided before meeting. Will review meeting minutes at next month's meeting.

V. Business Items (5:45)

a) Transportation Master Plan Update: Draft Vision and Goals (Discussion) – Carrie Wilhelme, Public Works

During the previous meeting, Carrie Wilhelme, Principal Transportation Planner, presented the 2015 vision and goals, prompting the Commission to agree on the necessity for updates. CM Casas and Carrie collaborated to draft new ones. This meeting, Carrie presented the revised vision and overarching goal language, receiving generally positive feedback from the Commission. A suggested improvement involved refining the statement to emphasize the creation and sustenance of a multimodal transportation system. Discussions ensued regarding the inclusion of specific nouns in the vision statement. There was a consensus among the Commission on the importance of achievable and timely goals, including those related to the economy, jobs, and equity commitments. Further clarification was sought regarding the concept of sustainability, encompassing fiscal and environmental aspects. The Commission agreed on the need to maintain a people-focused vision.

Commissioner Casas and Carrie committed to revisiting the goals based on the feedback received and providing updates to the Commission accordingly.

b) Commission's Biennial Budget Recommendation – Continued (Discussion) – Co-Chair Stevens

During the meeting, Co-Chair Stevens highlighted that the previous budget recommendation was too broad, emphasizing the need for specificity due to anticipated tighter budgets this year, with lower real estate excise tax revenue. Suggestions included prioritizing funding for quick-build projects, pedestrianizing streets, subarea planning for T-Line alternatives, sidewalk and ADA improvements, and enhancing active transport near the skatepark under I-705. It was agreed that the budget recommendation would be conveyed through a letter. CM Wrenn, CM Grellier, and Co-Chair Stevens were tasked with drafting the letter.

c) City Charter Recommendations (Discussion) – Co-Chair Stevens

During the meeting, Co-Chair Stevens provided a summary of the Charter recommendations, highlighting the proposal to enable the City Council with more support and elevate the Sustainable Tacoma Commission and neighborhood councils within the charter. Opinions varied regarding the potential impact on the Transportation Commission, with some advocating for neutrality. Jennifer Kammerzell, Assistant Division Manager, offered context regarding previous charter changes, noting the legal requirement for the Planning Commission. There was discussion about the possibility of advocating for either elevating all Commissions or none. It was emphasized that any letter written must maintain a positive tone, focusing on how changes would assist other Commissions in achieving their goals.

A motion was proposed by Co-Chair Stevens to draft a letter emphasizing the current benefits of the charter layout and expressing concerns about potential negative outcomes from changes, which was seconded by CM Grellier and unanimously approved. CM Goble and Co-Chair Stevens were assigned to write the letter.

Other Business/Updates (6:45)

CM Grellier let the Commission know about the June 17 Transit Trivia night as part of Transit Month.


