# **RESOLUTION NO. 41495**

A RESOLUTION setting Tuesday, September 24, 2024, upon completion of Regular Agenda Items, no earlier than 5:15 p.m., as the date for a public hearing by the City Council on the Home In Tacoma Phase 2 zoning and standards package, as recommended by the Planning Commission.

WHEREAS on December 7, 2021, the City Council passed Amended Ordinance No. 28793 approving the Home In Tacoma ("HIT") Project – Phase 1 package based on the work of the Planning Commission ("Commission") and the City Council's Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee, and

WHEREAS this action established a new housing growth vision for the City, supporting missing middle housing options, designating low-scale and midscale residential areas, and strengthening policies on infill design, affordability, anti-displacement, and other goals, and

WHEREAS this action also initiated HIT - Phase 2 to implement the new policies through changes to residential zoning and standards, along with actions to promote affordability and ensure that housing supports multiple community goals, and

WHEREAS HIT – Phase 2 began in 2022, with planning and public engagements starting in January 2023, and following extensive community engagement and adjustments to the initial HIT package to accommodate for state legislation, the Commission has worked for the last six months on making detailed decisions regarding recommended zoning, standards, bonuses, and other components of the HIT package, and

WHEREAS on June 5, 2024, the Commission made its final recommendation on the HIT – Phase 2 package, moving it forward to the full City Council for the final review, public hearing, and adoption, and

WHEREAS the formal letter of recommendation, findings and recommendations report, and other supporting documentation for the Commission's decision were recently completed and are available on the project website and notice of their availability has been widely distributed, and

WHEREAS the Commission's recommendations include significant proposed changes in three major areas: (1) changes to zoning, including three new urban residential zones for low and mid-scale density, (2) changes to parking regulations and requirements, including the designation of reduced parking areas, and (3) landscaping, including tree retention and minimum planting requirements, and

WHEREAS the City desires to fix a time and date for a public hearing for the purpose of considering the proposed HIT – Phase 2 zoning and standards package, as recommended by the Commission; Now, Therefore,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. WHEREAS at the July 29, 2024, Government Performance and Finance Committee ("Committee") special meeting, the Committee considered letters of interest and recommended individuals to the "For" and "Against" Committees for each proposed City Charter amendment; Now, Therefore,

## **RESOLUTION NO. 41497**

## BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS

A RESOLUTION relating to proposed amendments to the City Charter; consolidating and clarifying the recommendations of the City Council with respect to certain proposed City Charter and Municipal Code amendments not referred for placement on the ballot for the November 5, 2024, Special Municipal Election.

WHEREAS on October 17, 2023, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 41282, creating a Charter Review Committee ("CRC"), consisting of 15 citizens (residents), to review the existing Charter of the City of Tacoma ("City Charter") and make such recommendations to the City Council for City Charter amendments as the committee may deem necessary and proper to improve the manner of operation and efficiency in conducting the affairs of the City, and

WHEREAS on January 11, 2024, CRC members began to meet to review the City Charter and develop recommendations, and

WHEREAS on May 6, 2024, the City Council received the final report from the CRC and a presentation on their recommendations during a special meeting, and

WHEREAS during 13 public meetings the City Council reviewed and discussed the CRC recommendations together with proposed amendments to the CRC recommendations and amendments proposed by individual Council Members of the City Council, and

WHEREAS a public hearing was heard during the July 2, 2024, City Council meeting to take public testimony regarding the proposed City Charter amendments under consideration by the City Council, and



WHEREAS the City Council has had several discussions over the last two months on which amendments could be addressed through other pathways other than a change to the City Charter, and

WHEREAS at the July 9, 2024, regular meeting of the City Council, the City Council by separate motions approved eight proposed City Charter amendments for further consideration by the City Council for placement on the ballot at a Special Municipal Election, and concurrently, by separate motions referred 10 proposed City Charter amendments and one additional potential Municipal Code amendment, for further study and evaluation, and

WHEREAS the City Council desires to consolidate these motions within a single resolution and where necessary provide greater clarification regarding the scope and forum for study and evaluation of the 10 proposed City Charter amendments and potential Municipal Code amendment for future amendments to the City Charter or the Municipal Code, and

WHEREAS under the compressed timeline the City council was not able to fully address all of the City Charter recommendations that were considered, and by referring them to other processes, this will allow them to continue developing the recommendations and may lead to adoption of new recommendations in the future, and

WHEREAS many of the recommendations address specific discrimination language, accessibility to serve in public roles, and large programs or policies like the Neighborhood Councils or police accountability, and continued refinement of



these recommendations will better address the diverse needs of our community and ensure that equity remains top of mind during the conversations; Now, Therefore,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the following proposed amendments to the Charter of the City of Tacoma ("City Charter"), and the Tacoma Municipal Code ("TMC"), as recommended by the Charter Review Committee ("CRC") and City Council, in no particular order of priority or importance, are referred for further study and evaluation as set forth below:

- A. <u>CRC Proposed Charter Amendment No. 3 Referendum</u>. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred to the Government Performance and Finance Committee for additional study and evaluation.
- B. <u>CRC Proposed Charter Amendment No. 5 Charter Review</u>. The City Council finds that ensuring that community volunteers receive training and education and are given the resources and time to complete a thorough review of the City Charter will enhance support for decision making for future City Charter reviews. Providing additional time will allow Charter Review Committee members to engage fiscal and legal analysis to better understand the impacts of implementation, and work more closely with the City Council to understand the issues facing the City. The Charter Review Committee process can be supplemented for this purpose through amendments to the Municipal Code and will give the City Council the flexibility to align the process with the needs of the community. Accordingly, this proposed City Charter amendment will be further



studied and evaluated by the City Council through the Committee of the Whole which will begin review of this issue in 2024.

- C. <u>CRC Proposed Amendment No. 6 Neighborhood Council</u>. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred for further study and evaluation as part of the five-year Neighborhood Council review currently in progress through the Neighborhood and Community Services Department as required by Tacoma Municipal Code Section 1.45.090 "Review and revision". This five-year review will bring recommended changes to the City Council for consideration in 2024.
- D. CRC Proposed Amendment No. 8 Policing Accountability. The City Council understands the critical importance and intense public interest in police accountability and the public's demand for transparency and justice and is committed to taking action to bring sustainable oversight practices to Tacoma. The City Council believes that addressing this complex issue requires more ongoing, meaningful dialogue and collaboration with the Community's Police Advisory Committee ("CPAC"), who have been doing vital work on this topic and must be included in the solutions moving forward. Changes may need to be bargained when required by state law and taking the time to work together through good faith negotiations and having difficult conversations with CPAC and Tacoma Police Union, Local 6, I.U.P.A. ("Local 6") will allow for sustainable accountability. The City Council is committed to bringing forward a bargainable and sustainable policing accountability solution with Local 6 before the end of 2025. Toward that



end, the issue of policing accountability has been referred to an alternative process for additional study and evaluation by the City Council through their liaison to the CPAC in partnership with the committee.

- E. <u>CRC Proposed Charter Amendment No. 9B Climate Commission</u>. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee ("IPS Committee") for additional study and evaluation. The Council shares the Charter Review Commission's view that "the city needs to effectively track and hold accountable its commitments to sustainability and climate goals." The IPS Committee is asked to:
- a) review how a Climate Commission, or otherwise named, might enhance or replace the work of the existing Sustainable Tacoma Commission, and how that commission might be made up;
- b) review establishing a carbon budget, as set forth in the Climate Action

  Plan and recommended by the Charter Review Commission; and
- c) review other ways to empower and accelerate the goals of the Climate Action Plan, including possible code changes, to reach the City's goal of net zero emissions by 2050.
- F. <u>CRC Proposed Charter Amendment No. 11 Landmarks</u>

  <u>Preservation Commission</u>. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee for additional study and evaluation.

- G. CRC Proposed Charter Amendment No. 19 – Ranked-Choice Voting. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred to the Government Performance and Finance Committee for additional study and evaluation.
- Η. CRC Proposed Charter Amendment No. 20 – Campaign Finance. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred to the Government Performance and Finance Committee for additional study and evaluation.
- Council Proposed Charter Amendment C3B TPU Board Member 1 Stipends. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred to the Government Performance and Finance Committee for additional study and evaluation.
- J. Council Proposed Charter Amendment C5 – Initiative Fiscal Notes. This proposed City Charter amendment was referred to the Government Performance and Finance Committee for additional study and evaluation. Additional study will evaluate how fiscal notes could be developed for initiatives brought forward by the community on a ballot. This work of the Government Performance and Finance Committee will explore a requirement that the City create a process to develop a cost assessment of the initiative language and its impact to the city. This information would then be available to the community through the City's web page.
- Section 2. That the City Council at the July 9, 2024, meeting approved a motion directing the City Manager to include the study and evaluation of inclusion



of caste discrimination in the Tacoma Municipal Code. This item was an ancillary consideration by the Charter Review Committee and a new item that was not included in the recommendations reviewed by the City Council prior to the July 9, 2024, meeting.
