Dear Mayor Woodards, Deputy Mayor Daniels and Council Members,

I am writing to urge all of you to 'postpone' discussion, consideration and a vote on Ordinance 29024 ("Authorizing the execution of two wholesale water supply agreements with Cascade Water Alliance...") until AFTER the 'South Tacom Groundwater Protection District' code updates are formally reviewed and approved by the City Council..now slated to occur in several months.

This 'Water Supply Agreement' with Cascade Water Alliance DOES includes the 'groundwater' source of water supply from the South Tacoma aquifer/recharge area. This agreement is not dependent only on the Green River source of water supply. The South Tacoma groundwater situation has also bern factored into the overall 'available' water supply. While the IRP report (2024) does suggest that Tacoma/TPU is able to project adequate water supplies capacity in the future, we still need to have a final STGPD studies/report completed prior to setting up this 'Water Supply Contract' with Cascade Water Alliance.

Tacoma will have an increased use/reliance on the groundwater system as a 'drinking water' source in the future due to continued 'drought' conditions' (climate change) and the anticipated 50% increase in Tacoma population that will occur in the coming decades. This 'groundwater' system will be used more consistently as drinking water for Tacoma residents in the future.

This entire STGPD code updates include more than the 2024 IRP Report alone. Other areas with this STGPD code update are to be studied, reviewed and approved yet as part of these STGPD Updates.

It is both premature..and, risky to move forward now to approve this 'water supply agreement' when you do not have all the pertinent information and data available to make an educated decision. Please put this decision on hold until later 2025.
